

## Frequently Asked Questions for McGregor Patients

### **Will I receive a bill if the ambulance is called?**

McGregor only bills patients who were transported by the ambulance. This is separate from the hospital bill. In many cases, your insurance will pay the entire bill. In other cases, you may owe a part of the bill due to an insurance deductible or copay. We do have a hardship program for those unable to afford a bill (see below.) If the ambulance comes but does not transport there is no bill.

### **What if I receive a check directly from my insurance company?**

Some insurance companies may pay you directly for an ambulance ride with the expectation that you will then pay McGregor. ### **Will McGregor accept my particular type of health insurance?**

Our billing company, Enhanced, works with all health insurance companies to secure payment. Often this is done without involving the patient and you may not ever receive a bill. However, different health insurance companies provide different benefits and some may provide limited or no coverage for ambulance rides.

### **I cannot afford my portion of the bill, what can I do?**

McGregor has a very generous financial hardship program available to those who qualify. If you believe that paying an ambulance bill may pose a financial hardship then please complete a *Hardship Request Form*. This form is available from our billing company. ### **Why am I receiving a bill? Don't my taxes pay for the ambulance?**

McGregor receives only about 6% of its budget from community appropriations (taxes). While this contribution is important, it does not come close to paying the cost of operating advanced life support ambulances around the clock. We do our best to reduce costs through the extensive use of trained volunteers and by carefully controlling expenses. We never deny treatment or transport due to an inability to pay.

### **What is McGregor EMS and what services do you provide?**

We are a professional, nonprofit ambulance service, which has been serving the communities of Durham, Lee, Madbury, and the University of New Hampshire since 1968. We utilize a group of highly trained volunteers supplemented with some paramedics to ensure that advanced life support care is available 24 x 7.
